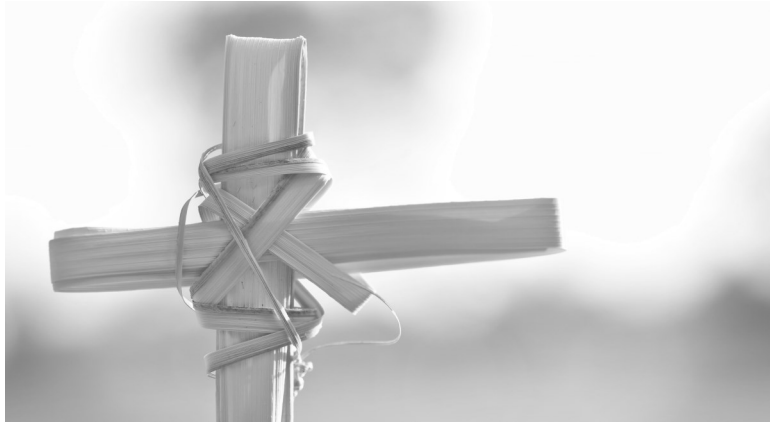

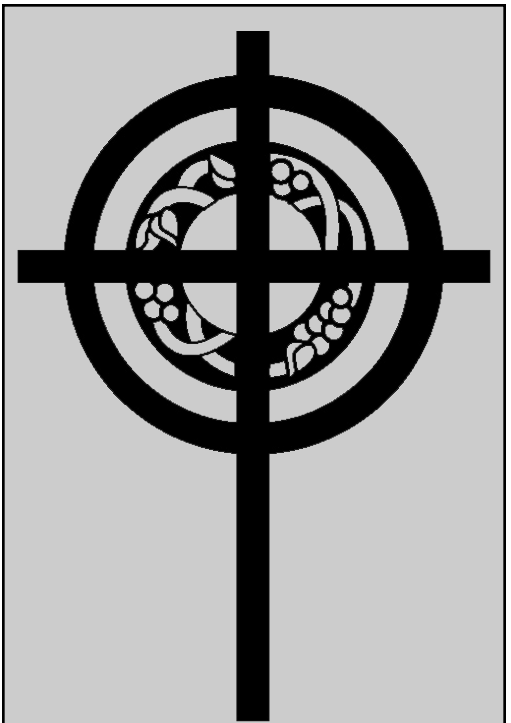
Holy Week Schedule

Easter Sunday, April 5

We are working so that our Easter Sunday is a glorious one that glorifies God. To do that, we need your help.

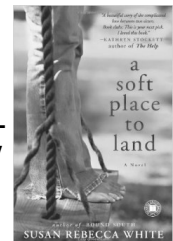

Invite a Friend to Worship

This year, most of March is also the season of Lent in our Christian calendar. We will spend time in contemplation and preparation, worship and service. On the last Sunday of the month, we begin the drama of Holy Week, starting with Palm Sunday's parade, through Maundy Thursday, to the grave, and beyond with our celebration of Easter on April 5.

Whether you are new to our community, a long-term member, or somewhere in between, please consider inviting someone you know to worship at Oglethorpe Presbyterian during Lent and Holy Week. A recent US Congregational Life Survey said almost half of first-time church visitors came because someone invited them. And 57% said they already had a friend in the congregation they visited.

Get "Engaged"!

Beginning after Easter, Oglethorpe Presbyterian will launch a program called "Engage". A congregation-wide study, Engage will help us explore how to share our faith with one another and with others. In a word, it's about Evangelism. Marthame introduced "Engage" in his February 15 sermon, and you will hear more about it in March.



If you're like many of us who find the word "evangelism" uncomfortable, then this program might just be for you! Engage teaches that evangelism is not the process of going door-to-door, forcing pamphlets into people's hands, or manipulating every conversation into faith and Jesus. Instead, evangelism is a natural experience, living lives of integrity that speak for themselves, being comfortable at expressing our faith, and conversations about faith that arise naturally.

There will be several groups meeting at different times during the week. Our goal is to have half of our community participating in a group as we grow through discussion, fellowship, and sharing. We will be with each other, connecting, sharing our challenges and joys as people of faith trying to figure it out.

The Freedom of Consensus

The story is told of the local church that had a history of making all major decisions by consensus. They were used to this process when they were faced with a big problem: resources were declining and church membership was, too. The question of what to do next came to a head when their pastor of many years decided to retire.

For a number of months, the members discussed their options informally, and it became clear that a wide variety of opinions existed among the congregation. Every option had pluses and minuses, strengths and weaknesses.

Finally they met to decide. As the meeting went on,

people felt freer to express their hopes and fears, freer to caringly question themselves and others, freer to notice the nuanced views of other members. It was clear that concern about the members was the major value.

At the end, they did in fact in reach consensus. They found a solution that didn’t satisfy everyone, but one that everyone could support.

We endeavor to do the same in our congregation. Thank you for sharing your thoughts, hopes, concerns, and resources freely and honestly.
