One thing that has become clear in our conversations is an impressive history of shared support between the Preschool and the broader Church. When building repairs and improvements have been made, we have worked together to fix what is broken and develop and expand our facilities. We plan to continue to build on our past partnership as we minister to our community.

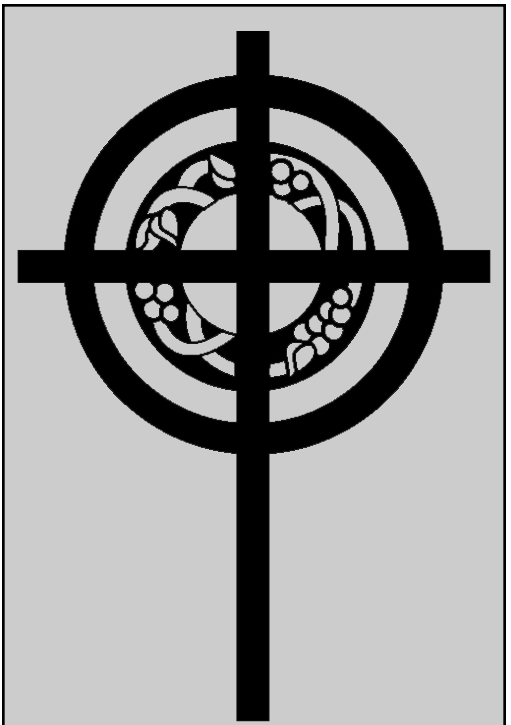

## Chapel Task Force Update

These guidelines have been helpful as we have dreamed of what is possible. We expect to make recommendations to Session at the May meeting, and will look forward to sharing those with our community.

In the meantime, we are asking for ideas and suggestions from the Church, Preschool, and Brookhaven communities. One such opportunity will be on Sunday, May 3, following worship when the chapel will be open. Other opportunities will follow.

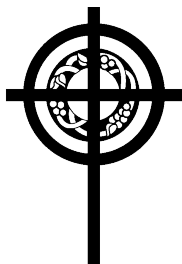

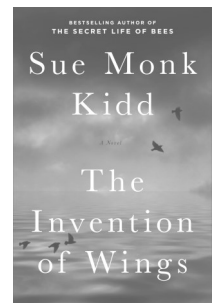

### L'Arche

It started with an act of kindness.

In 1964, Jean Vanier invited two men with developmental disabilities to share a house



near Paris. It was a life-changing move for the Canadian philosopher that would, over time, radically improve the lives of many others.

Vanier had been a spiritual seeker most of his life, but the major turning point came a year earlier when he visited people with disabilities who were living in psychiatric hospitals and other institutions. One of them reportedly asked him, "Will you be my friend?"

Though the two men, Raphael Simi and Philippe Seux, had been institutionalized and essentially shunned by the world, Vanier reached out in recognition of their shared humanity. That first leap would serve as the spark for *L'Arche Internationale*, today a global network of residential communities in which people with and without disabilities share their lives.

This year, in honor of Vanier's five decades of advocacy for people with disabilities, he is being named the 2015 recipient of the Templeton Prize, given annually to a person who "has made an exceptional contribution to affirming life's spiritual dimension, whether through insight, discovery, or practical works."

It started with an act of kindness... "Yes, I will be your friend."

Thank you for all the acts of kindness you perform, for our church, for our neighborhood, for our world.

- Revenue for the first quarter of 2015 vs. 2014 is up \$5,600.
- Expenses, primarily related to maintenance, are up for the quarter, so the result is a deficit of \$5,000.
- The pledged offering income for January, February, and March was below budget.
- The increase in revenue for the quarter was primarily due to the gap matching fund contributions.
- Receipts and expenditures do not include Capital Campaign but bank balance does.

## 2015 Budget Conversations

As many of you know, our 2015 budgeting process began with an anticipated deficit. The good news is that, with characteristic generosity, our community has moved the needle in the right direction! What was once a \$65,000 gap became \$50,000; and with our matching gift challenge, this gap narrowed even closer to \$26,000. Add to this that we are maintaining a healthy three-month operating reserve, and this is good news.

The challenge remains. As a partial response, Session has proposed trimming an additional \$8500 from the budget. On Sunday, April 26, Session hosted a congregational forum to solicit wisdom and counsel from our community on how best to balance our budget. Though Presbyterian polity is clear that financial decisions are entrusted to the Session, your elders felt that such a forum was appropriate given our commitment to transparency.

We are grateful to those of you who attended for your valuable wisdom and suggestions, including ways to further decrease spending and increase our “income”. One important point: we are not planning to decrease our Mission giving at all. Not only is this principle important to who we are at Oglethorpe Presbyterian; it is important to who we are as followers of Jesus.
