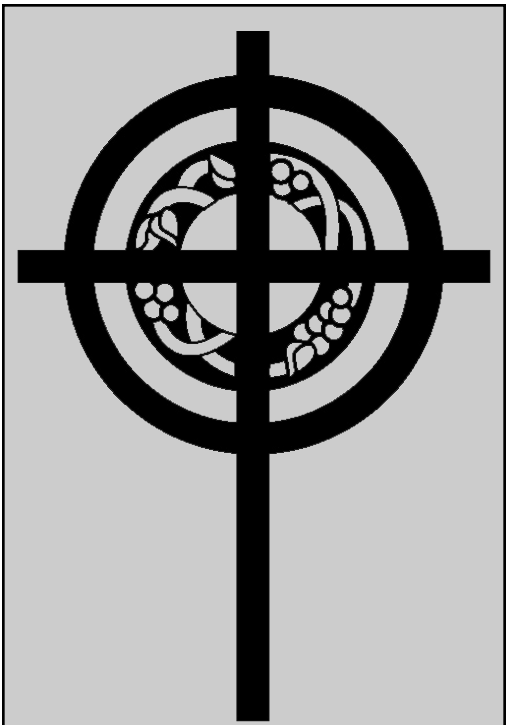
Please bring a salad or desert to share at lunch along with our chicken and pork BBQ main course.

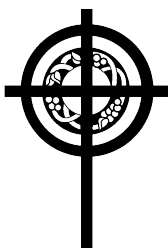

The Session conducted its monthly meeting on Saturday, August 16. Among its actions were to:

- Authorize the baptism of Charlotte Michelle Phillips on Sunday August 23, 2015
- Approve the curricula and teachers for Sunday School
- Appoint the After School Formation Team to further explore the feasibility of an After School Program. Team members include Cindy Alexander, Margy Jones, and Mark Kelly. Resource members include: Bill Cox, Cheryl Hartman, and Lynnette Kachel.

- Approve the budget through the end of 2015.
- Approve the Budget Task Force recommendations, including:
  - A special ask to cover the cost of a floor buffer (approximately \$3,000)
  - Each committee will refine their budget for the remainder of 2015 and for 2016
  - Session will prepare two budgets for 2016: one status quo, one austerity
  - We will hold a Finance Town Hall on Sunday, October 25, following worship
  - Mission giving is exempt from any proposed reductions for 2015 or 2016

# Our Financial Picture and Planning

While there is much to celebrate in our financial outlook - two years of balanced budgets, increased stewardship contributions, a successful capital campaign - your Session leadership continues to work to communicate our situation with candor and transparency:

- It is likely that we will finish 2015 with a deficit. Our best guess, at this point, is \$20,000. Rather than come back to the congregation to ask for increased pledges, we will use our reserves. Since this is a short-term solution at best, each committee is looking to trim spending for 2015 and 2016.
- Our Mission giving will not be affected. These ministries of service are central to who we are, so our mission budget will be intact for 2015 and 2016.
- We are looking to improve our communications with our budget, spending, and the impact our giving has on our immediate and broader community.
- Our Stewardship campaign will offer two budget possibilities: one to maintain our ministry, and one to keep our reserves intact.
- We will have regular opportunities for community conversation around various ministries. Our next opportunity will be a Financial Town Hall meeting on Sunday, October 25, following worship.
- We have two specific asks in 2015. The first is to help cover the unexpected cost of a floor buffer; the second is our usual end of the year request.
- As our Capital Campaign draws to a close, we will ask those who have contributed to consider continuing to give in 2016, whether by rolling that into your annual gift or to a specific maintenance fund.

One more note: it has taken longer than expected to report all of this back to you. This is partially due to unanticipated transitions in our bookkeeping contracts. We are resolving this in short order so we can continue to keep you informed. Thank you for your patience.

Above all, we thank God for your generosity and support. Our blessings are many, and our opportunities to share them are a true gift!
