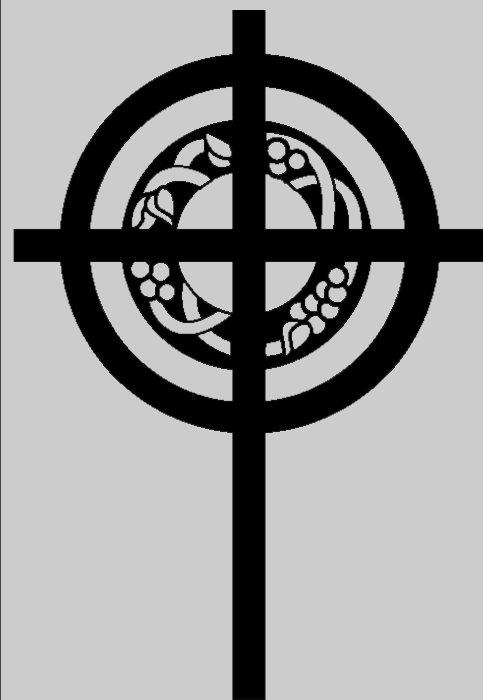

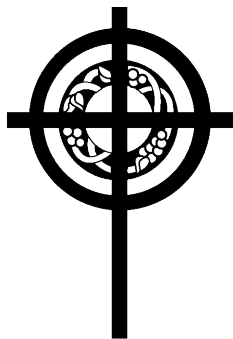

The Hunger Walk/Run -- an annual 5K walk and "fun run" begun in 1984 -- is a project of the Atlanta Community Food Bank that unites our community to raise awareness and critical funds for local hunger relief. Proceeds from the event benefit the Atlanta Community Food Bank and other local nonprofit organizations that support food pantries, community kitchens, shelters and other programs for people in need of food assistance. These benefiting partner organizations help recruit participants and receive a percentage of the funds raised to support their direct hunger relief programs. **In its 32 years, Hunger Walk/Run has raised over \$7 million for hunger relief - enough to provide 28 million meals!**

- Thanks to extraordinarily generous giving in December, OPC ended 2015 with a deficit of only \$2,007 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$15,078.
- Versus 2014, expenditures increased by \$10,266 or 3% with staff costs up \$16,136 and maintenance up \$4,735. Utilities decreased by \$6,872 and all other items decreased \$3,733.

- Receipts and expenditures do not include Capital Campaign but bank balance does.
