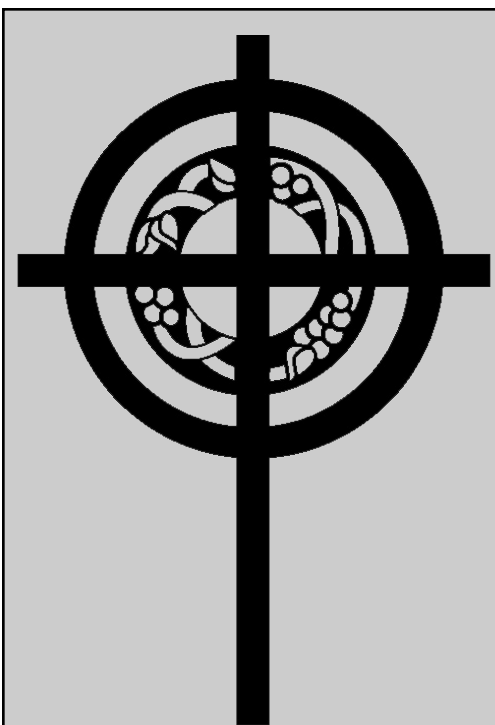

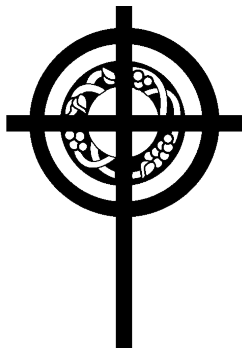

DEACONS

What Deacons Do

When someone breaks a hip, has a hospitalized child, loses a parent, is diagnosed with cancer, is depressed or lonely, welcomes the birth of a baby, or has other needs or concerns, the deacons are available to provide support and help. Oglethorpe Presbyterian has six ordained deacons who are specifically called to minister to those in need. Our deacons are Georgia Gunter, Debra Hogan, Margy Jones, Linda Morris, and Eleanor Timmons. In May, Eleanor will have completed three years of service, and Debra will have completed two years of service. We will welcome Marianne Martin, Debbie O'Donnell, and Rachel Paterson as new deacons to replace Eleanor, Debra and our dearly departed Linda Jones. Each deacon is assigned specific Oglethorpe members and friends to serve.

The deacons meet monthly with Pastors Marthame and Linda Hawthorne to discuss the needs of which they are aware and to pray for those in need. They plan how to address the identified needs: with visits, rides, food, calls, cards, or whatever seems most appropriate. Almost daily, e-mails flow between the deacons and staff about needs that have been identified

and support that is being provided or is needed. Many times, the deacons simply serve as coordinators, calling upon other church members to provide assistance and then coordinating those efforts. In fact, often times other Oglethorpe members are already providing support and assistance before the deacons even hear of the needs.

One of the most meaningful ministries provided by the deacons is the healing service. Since we are all in need of healing, be it physical, mental, spiritual or emotional, all are encouraged to attend. The service includes laying on of hands, anointing with oil, and prayer. The deacons also plan the All Saints memorial service where we celebrate the lives of those who have passed in the last year. The deacons also take communion to those who are unable to come to worship.

The Food Pantry

During the first quarter of 2016, the Oglethorpe Food Pantry at the Suthers' Center provided food to 776 families which includes 2,807 family members. So far this year they have given out 35,332 pound of food. Each family receives three large bags of canned goods, spaghetti, Mac and Cheese, bread, pastries, fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, dish washing liquids, laundry detergent and fresh meat and milk when available.

A Special Giving Opportunity

Vintage buildings like ours provide unique challenges. We are in the process of tackling one of those challenges: replacing old tile flooring on the Fellowship Hall level (Hallway, Boiler Room, and Red Room).

When the older tile was installed, it was normal practice to use adhesive that contained asbestos as a fire retardant. We have since learned of the possible health risks that asbestos presents if the tile is broken, comes loose, or is otherwise dis-

turbed. As long as the tile is intact, the asbestos is safely sealed out of harm's way. The removal process is a specialized field requires licensing and careful monitoring to prevent any further risk as the tile is disposed.

We estimate that the total cost for replacement will be \$4,000. If you would like to give toward this opportunity, please send your contributions to the church marked accordingly. Thank you for your support!
